STATE LIBRARY INFO

The following is from Gary Strong, State Librarian, on what has been done about the 1980 Master Plan Draft Goals for Libraries.

On March 6, 1981 the Steering Committee met with representatives of a wide range of library organizations and unanimously agreed to move forward in Working Groups to develop nine currently identified areas for Library Directions for the '80s-a Master Plan for California Libraries. The next phase will build on the excellent comments received in response to the draft goals issued in October, 1980. The Master Plan Steering Committee, meeting at the State Library, decided to seek volunteers to work on a preliminary draft of the Master Plan to be issued for discussion in August, 1981, and to solicit ideas for it.

The August 1981 draft of the Plan will be prepared by Working Groups comprised of both volunteers and Steering Committee members. Each Working Group will focus on one of the nine topical areas, including last October's seven proposed areas of Awareness, Access, Users, Services, Personnel, Support, and Cooperation, and two new areas responsive to the library community's suggestions, Research and a General area to work on the Plan's format and style and on the Master Plan process itself. The Groups will revise the draft goals in light of the many helpful comments received, and develop action-oriented objectives to work toward those goals. The first part of this stage will be completion of the draft for August 1981 dissemination, and the second part will be additional work and revision in time for the next draft to be issued in late November 1981.
